Our properties are located at 650 and 656 Broadway. They are on the South side of Broadway, between Langside and Furby Streets. It is an economically depressed inner-city area that has a dense population of both indigent and low-functioning families and individuals, plus a significant number of first-time home buyers. We purposefully situated the CPC in the middle of the West Broadway district of Winnipeg. The location is central not only to poorer families and immigrants, many of whom struggle trying to survive everyday life, but it is also situated in the middle of the University of Winnipeg student population.

Although the West Broadway district crime rates are 91% higher than the national average, and 113% higher for violent crimes, during the day it is generally a safe and welcoming community.

Our Clients

The heart and soul of our Centre are the clients that we serve. In 2020 (our latest statistics) we saw 314 'new' clients, and had over 1,200 at-centre client visits; this doesn't including many hundreds of client phone calls, emails, and texts. Our Centre had the most 'material support' client appointments of any centre in Canada; with some 75% of our services involving supplying clients with maternity clothing, baby clothing, diapers, formula, and other 'material' goods. We deeply appreciate and love the clients we are honoured to serve.

The majority of our current client population includes some 9% African, 15% Asian (Far East, Southeast Asia, and Indian subcontinent), and 27% Indigenous.

A Few Client Quotes

"I am five months pregnant and I am struggling with depression. I am divorced, have no family here and not many friends. I have had serious depression before after a miscarriage and after having my son (he is two now)."

"I am a mother of 3, currently 24 weeks pregnant, and I lost my youngest daughter at the age of 9 months on Valentine's Day this year. Is there any way I can get some help?"

"I thought about it lots before I was ever pregnant and I knew what I would do. I know I should have been more careful but I wasn't thinking. The father wants me to have the baby but I know for a fact that neither of us are responsible enough or ready for this."

"I have a friend who has received help from you because she had an abortion. She suggested I could get help from you for counselling. I gave a baby up for adoption in 1975. I don't expect that qualifies. But if it does how do I move forward from here to seek help from you?"

"I am a 23 year old single mom and pregnant with my second child. This is my third pregnancy in 3 years. My first I had a miscarriage at my 11 week mark. I was devastated. I have gotten pregnant again now after my miscarriage. Due to finances I'm forced to make the most difficult decision of my life. I have thought through adoption but wouldn't be able to give away my own flesh and blood. Can I talk to somebody?"

Our Mission Statement

Our Director

During the early 1980's, Juergen Severloh, the founding director of the Crisis Pregnancy Centre (CPC), had spent the formative years of his social service development at Marymount, a locked residential treatment institution. After six years he transitioned from Marymount to work directly with Child & Family Services in residential homes helping stabilize families. Having always wanted to work in the core area of Winnipeg, he developed the CPC of Winnipeg.

Our Centre

The Crisis Pregnancy Centre of Winnipeg client population includes people from all over Winnipeg along with people from all over Manitoba. We have seen clients from Regina to Thunder Bay, and Thompson to Emerson. Our client statistics have changed significantly in the last ten years. In the past decade we have had a marked rise in the amount of immigrant families that are seeking assistance. Although statistics can be both hard to tabulate and therefore difficult to present accurately, here are some of ours.

The CPC properties are located at 650 and 656 Broadway. They are on the South side of Broadway, between Langside and Furby Streets. It is an economically depressed inner-city area that has a dense population of both indigent and low-functioning families and individuals, plus a significant number of first-time home buyers. We purposefully situated the CPC in the middle of this West Broadway district of Winnipeg. The location is central not only to poorer families and immigrants, many of whom struggle trying to survive everyday life, but it is also situated in the middle of the University of Winnipeg student population.

Although the West Broadway district has one of the highest crime rates in Winnipeg, during the day it is generally a safe and welcoming community. (cf. Addendum A)

Over the past three plus decades the Centre has developed an extensive list of valuable community services and activities that have benefited many thousands of clients. (cf. Addendum B)

Our Clients

The heart and soul of our Centre are the clients that we serve. In 2020 (our latest statistics) we saw 314 'new' clients, and had over 1,200 at-centre client visits; this doesn't including many hundreds of client phone calls, emails, and texts. Our Centre had the most 'material support' client appointments of any centre in Canada; some 75% of our services involving supplying clients with maternity clothing, baby clothing, diapers, formula, and other 'material' goods. We deeply appreciate and love the clients we are honoured to serve. (cf. Addendum C1 and C2)

Our 'Pregnancy Care Canada' Affiliation

The Crisis Pregnancy Centre of Winnipeg is affiliated with our national organization Pregnancy Care Canada. Our Winnipeg Centre was one of a half-dozen centres that formed and developed PCC. Our primary purpose, back in the mid-1990's was to create materials that were truthful and accurate for all of the Canadian CPCs. Being a 'best practice' organization we have high standards for affiliation. (cf. Addendum D)

Our Centre, and Pregnancy Care Canada agrees with what the Liberal Party of Canada 'Forward for Everyone' platform outlined in September 2021; saying that, if elected, the Liberal Party would "No longer provide charity status to anti-abortion organizations (for example, Crisis Pregnancy Centres) that provide **dishonest counseling** ..." (emphasis added)

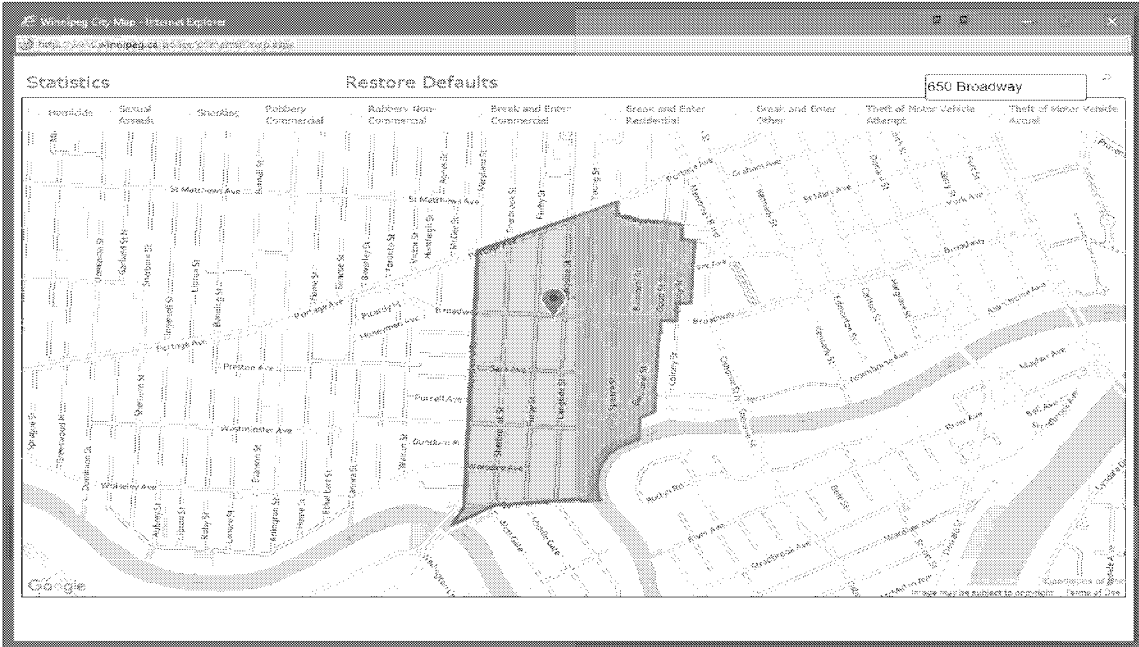
This is precisely why we developed the PCC, to ensure that affiliated centres would hold to the highest standards. Ensuring that every affiliated CPC would have policies, processes, and materials that were up-to-date, accurate, and truthful. The PCC has year-round workshops and webinars that ensure the highest level of training. Furthermore, annually, every affiliated centre has to affirm and comply with a rigorous set of standards. The PCC is restrictive in its affiliation, and not every pregnancy centre in Canada is allowed to be affiliated.

The Winnipeg CPC and the national PCC understands that we wish to create an honest and open relationship with the clients we serve. Any kind of dishonesty would undercut that relationship; rendering ineffective any service or care we would want to provide.

From our very beginnings, the Winnipeg CPC has used a simple philosophy that helps us keep our perspectives clear; we call it 'Responsibility For vs Responsibility To'. It is useful for all kinds of relationships: counselling, partnerships, parent-child, and friendships. (cf. Addendums E and F)

I found your website as recommended by someone. I am living on Vancouver Island but I was wondering if someone could talk to me over the phone? I'm in desperate need of advice as I am in Canada at the moment and going to be starting a two year criminology diploma in September. I would really appreciate if I could talk to someone about my options as I am so lost. I have known for a week and my mind is changing daily and sometimes hourly. Is it at all possible for someone to call me?

Samantha

I just found out I was pregnant today, and I'm not sure where to start. I have some medical issues and I don't know where to go to confirm the pregnancy, ultrasounds and stuff. I'm new to the city. I need help!

Paige

I found out I was pregnant on Thursday. The guy who I got pregnant with, we were together for not even two months and aren't together anymore. He knows I'm pregnant, and pressures me every day to get an abortion. I've only told a couple people and 2/5 have said to get an abortion. The thought of getting an abortion kills me inside. I feel like I would not be able to live with myself. I'm stuck in a hard spot and I'm so stressed out, I don't know what I'm supposed to do. I know my family would be so mad, one of my sisters just had a miscarriage at 11 weeks with a planned pregnancy, so she wouldn't be able to even talk to me. My child's father would hate me. I can't even imagine the names I would be called. I'm only 21 and I don't know what to do.

Olivia

Hi, so I'm a little bit in a panic mode right now because I had unprotected sex during my period but it was more like spotting, because two days after the intercourse my period was gone. I was paranoid the day after because it was the first time that we had unprotected sex. I took Plan B on the 3rd day. Is there a big chance that I would get pregnant? Or not? When is it okay to take the pregnancy test? Please help me answer my questions. Thank you.

Thank you to whoever is reading this. I'm an 18 (going on 19) year old female. Soon, I'm going to be taking a test to see if I'm actually pregnant. I'm 80% sure that I am pregnant..I have a lot of the signs now and I've waited around two weeks since my estimated period day. I just really want reassurance that everything is going to be okay. I don't know what I want to do if I'm positive. I just don't think it's a good time for me..not right now. I've been really struggling with life lately.

Madison

My daughter chose to have an abortion last January. I could see she hasn't been herself but didn't know why until tonight. I need to find her people who will understand exactly how she feels. My daughter is 19, she feels completely alone, she feels that no one really understands. She says she feels like an empty shell and relives her experience at the abortion clinic. She feels broken, is the way she describes herself. I can see my daughter struggling with the decision she made then, she's in a deep dark hole of depression. I need to help her find people that can relate. Any information you could provide would be of great assistance. I am hoping to find a place as soon as possible so that she can find a way to forgive herself. She keeps saying that selfish. Thank you for any help you can provide.

Susan

Hi, my name is 'Susan' and I had an abortion a year ago. My doctor referred me to your centre as I have been dealing with depression and grief ever since. I felt I made my decision based on what was best for the situation I was in but ever since have felt heartbreak and loss and wish I could go back in time and change what I decided to do. I know that can't be done but I need help in finding a way to move on. The only thing I really want out of life is to be with someone I love and have a family, but I also want to be able to offer my children the most I possibly can and at the time I didn't have the financial support or emotional support from my partner.

Stacey

I just found out that I am 5 weeks pregnant. I already talked to my boyfriend and my and his parents. They told me that they will help us as much as they can. I am still worried, I don't want to get an abortion, but I am scared that anything can go wrong. I am a student plus an international student. I just need some verbal or moral support. I don't want to give up.

Addendum F: Responsible For vs Responsible To (Explanation)

When I Feel Responsible FOR Others

Being responsible 'FOR' someone means that you are taking on the responsibility for what that person believes and how that person behaves.

For instance, it is reasonable for a parent to be responsible 'FOR' their young or early-teen child.

Ensuring that they are safe and that they are being properly educated and taught.

If we try to take responsibility for an older child (late teens or an adult) ... or with someone who is independent of our family, we will only frustrate them and inevitably alienate them.

Even though our intentions may be entirely honorable, the person will eventually end up feeling unheard and disrespected.

The relationship may become so strained that all trust is dissolved and the relationship is fractured.

When I Feel Responsible TO Others

Being responsible 'TO' someone means that you are allowing the other person to remain an independent person; in charge of their own thoughts and decisions.

For instance, it is reasonable for a parent to be responsible 'TO' their adult child.

Allowing them to have opinions and make decisions that you might not agree with.

This does not mean that we don't give our opinion about important concerns; it does mean that we share our thoughts and opinions in ways that are not over-bearing or manipulative.

Allowing the person to be 'right' or 'wrong'; and allowing them to hold opinions and behave in ways that we may disagree with.

This helps the person to respect your own ideas and consider your own thoughts.

Dear Chrystia Freeland, Deputy Prime Minister:

In its Election Platform, the Liberal Party issued a blanket condemnation of all pro-life groups across Canada. They claimed: “anti-choice organizations are actively working to spread *misinformation* about abortion, putting the health and safety of young people and vulnerable women at risk.” What are the “facts” to back up that statement, as they have never been listed or explained?

The Liberals then went on to make this promise: “A re-elected Liberal government will... no longer provide charity status to anti-abortion organizations (for example, Crisis Pregnancy Centres) that provide *dishonest counseling* to women about their rights and about the options available to them at all stages of the pregnancy.” Again, what is this dishonest counseling – that needs to be clarified!

It appears that the Liberal government is both uninformed about what Crisis Pregnancy Centre and hundreds of pro-life community service organizations across this country actually do.

According to Pregnancy Care Canada, a national Crisis Pregnancy organization, over 30,000 individuals accessed help last year from their 80 affiliated Pregnancy Care Centres. Over 7,000 clients received material supplies such as diapers, formula, and clothing. Over 600 women requested and received post-abortion support.

We talk about Human Rights but that doesn't seem to pertain to the rights of the unborn child. Right now, the womb is the most dangerous place to be – not Covid, not Ukraine but the womb. Statistics prove out that more people died in the womb in 2020 than from any other cause.

Crisis Pregnancy Centres make an invaluable contribution to Canadian society, providing resources, support, supplies, information, and options to women facing an unexpected or challenging pregnancy. The women served by these organizations seek out their assistance freely, and they are never forced to choose life for their babies.

Without these organizations, women in crisis would have fewer options and fewer supports for them in their pregnancy experience. In fact, most would feel they have only one choice: abortion. And one choice means no choice at all!

Furthermore, if the Liberal government succeeds in revoking the charitable status of Crisis Pregnancy Centres, what will stop them from introducing a new type of “Liberal Values Test” for all types of charities – including churches, synagogues, mosques, schools, camps, soup kitchens, and food banks? If any of these groups holds to a pro-life perspective, they may lose their status and face closure.

I am asking you to oppose any bill, motion, or regulatory policy that seeks to penalize Crisis Pregnancy Centres in Canada.

I'm a resident of MP Stephanie Kusie's riding of Calgary Midnapore.

Thank you for serving Canadians as our Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Finance! I cannot imagine the stress and weight that comes from this role. I pray that God will strengthen your body and mind and give you resilience as you fulfill this challenging role.

I recently read the Mandate Letter that Prime Minister Trudeau sent you in December 2021

(<https://pm.gc.ca/en/mandate-letters/2021/12/16/deputy-prime-minister-and-minister-finance-mandate-letter>). I appreciate many things outlined in the letter, such as efforts to make housing more affordable for Canadians. Thank you!

An item that concerns me is the following point:

"Introduce amendments to the Income Tax Act to make anti-abortion organizations that provide dishonest counselling to pregnant women about their rights and options ineligible for charitable status".

I believe that pregnant women who are unsure whether they want to continue their pregnancy should be provided with truthful information regarding carrying their baby to term, adoption, and terminating the pregnancy, so that they can make informed decisions. I imagine you agree. I understand that the Liberal party is pro-abortion. Knowing that, I'm curious what the party and the Prime Minister define as "dishonest counseling to pregnant women about their rights and options". Does the Prime Minister define this as an organization truthfully outlining what abortion entails and the mental health risks post-abortion? If so, I respectfully disagree. How do you plan to go about ascertaining which organizations are providing false information when counseling pregnant women about their rights and options? Will you and/or your team be assessing the information that every pregnancy care centre across the country provides to their clients? Or will you/your team only be identifying "anti-abortion" centres and removing their charitable status, without looking in detail into the truthfulness of the counseling they provide their clients? Would this also apply to faith-based organizations? For instance, if a rabbi, imam, or pastor counsels a pregnant member of their congregation who is weighing her options regarding her pregnancy and outlines the risks associated with abortion, will that synagogue/temple/mosque/church lose its charitable status? I would hope not.

I appreciate your and the Prime Minister's desire to ensure that pregnant women receive truthful information about their rights and options regarding their pregnancies. I agree that is essential so that women can make informed decisions. I believe that, as outlined in the Mandate Letter, though, there is a serious risk of anti-abortion organizations losing their charitable status simply because they oppose abortion. This would seriously impact the ability of these organizations, such as the Calgary Pregnancy Care Centre here in Calgary, to carry out their important and necessary work, as some donors might give financially because they know that they will receive a tax deductible receipt. Removing these organization's charitable status could result in these organizations receiving significantly less funds, which would impede their ability to care for pregnant women.

I encourage you, Prime Minister, and the Minister for Women and Gender Equality and Youth (both cc'd) to reconsider amending the Income Tax Act in this way.

I've cc'd my MP, Stephanie Kusie, so that she is aware that a constituent of hers opposes this amendment.

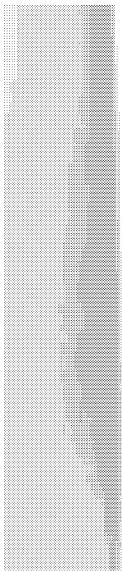

I'm reaching out to you today on behalf of the
regarding proposed changes to the Income Tax Act.

I understand that the Prime Minister's mandate letter instructs the Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Finance to change the Income Tax Act so that "anti-abortion organizations that provide dishonest counseling to pregnant women about their rights and options" are ineligible for charitable status.

I'm very concerned about this proposal for a number of reasons.

If an organization's charitable status can be put at risk simply because its views are different than those of the government, all charities are at risk. It means that every time the government adopts a new view or political priority, or any time a new government is elected, charitable status for specific groups will be in jeopardy.

No category of charity should be targeted for deregistration, singled out for more audits, or subject to additional monitoring based on whether or not its views align with those of the government.

To be clear, I agree that charities shouldn't be involved in dishonest practices. But dishonest conduct by charities is already addressed by the law in other ways.

I'm also very concerned that this approach risks silencing any charity that objects to or supports changes in the law, positions they are allowed to take. Canadians hold a wide variety of views on all sorts of issues. That diversity is rightly reflected in the charitable sector. Expressing diverse views, especially on social and political issues, is fundamental to a democratic society. Charities are no exception.

Please do not implement the proposed changes. They would set a dangerous precedent and put all charities at risk.

Dear Hon. Minister Freeland and Hon. Minister LeBouthillier,

a registered Canadian charity, is writing you to express our deep concern over your government's promise to remove charitable status for "anti-abortion organizations (for example, Crisis Pregnancy Centres) that provide dishonest counselling to women about their rights and about the options available to them at all stages of pregnancy."

Though our organization's charitable status is not at risk with your promise, we are deeply convicted that charitable status should not be linked to having a particular belief or value system that aligns with the government of the day. Removing charitable status is a serious, significant, and punitive measure. The Canada Revenue Agency reserves revocation for "the most serious circumstances, including deliberate or repeat non-compliance."

We are also concerned that this promise is a threat to the freedom of religion and the freedom of expression as protected in Section 2 of the Canadian Charter of Rights & Freedoms which reads as follows:

"Everyone has the following fundamental freedoms: freedom of conscience and religion; freedom of thought, belief, opinion and expression, including freedom of the press and other media of communication; freedom of peaceful assembly; and freedom of association."

As a Canadian citizen I wish to express my concerns about your government's plan to remove charitable status from our crisis pregnancy centres, based on the accusation that they are giving false information to the women who come to them seeking help. Your government has been vague as to just what this false information is. My suspicion is that it is the prolife belief that the unborn child is a human person. The presumption that the fetus is not a human being is often presented as an undisputed fact. I am writing to express my deep concern and ask for clarification. The Liberal Party platform, “Forward For Everyone”, stated that a re-elected Liberal government will “No longer provide charity status to anti-abortion organizations (for example, Crisis Pregnancy Centres) that provide dishonest counseling to women about their rights and about the options available to them at all stages of the pregnancy.”

Given the context of the Canada Summer Jobs attestation, I am very concerned at the idea that participation in the public square and a level playing field with respect to government programs could be conditional on acceptance of a particular view of abortion; in essence, subject to a values test.

If there is such a significant review of charitable status, there would need to be answers to basic questions such as

- what is considered “dishonest counseling,”
- what mechanism would identify dishonesty,
- whether the provisions are to be applied to all charitable organizations or only those organizations with particular underlying beliefs about when life begins,
- and how this would be carried out in compliance with Charter protections.

I am also concerned by the mischaracterization implicit in the platform statement. Pregnancy care centres are a source of support for many Canadian women. Pregnancy Care Canada (PCC) is a best practice association of over 80 pregnancy care centres. These PCC centres exist to provide a safe environment for women to make pregnancy decisions that are fully informed, evidence-based, consistent with their belief system and free from external influences. They respect a woman’s right to make her own decision and seek to provide her with medically accurate information on abortion, adoption and parenting.

A democracy such as Canada. is founded on the premise that diverse beliefs will be respected and accommodated. Any endeavor to revoke charitable status on the basis of beliefs about abortion would seem to risk violating Charter guarantees of freedom of conscience, religion, thought, belief, opinion and expression, and as well, specifically minimizing the rights of women.

My wife and I have been residents of the London West constituency for almost 50 years. I have had the privilege of writing to a great many of your predecessors on a variety of topics in that period of time. Allow me first to congratulate you on your being elected Member of Parliament to represent us in the 2021 federal election. Serving as an M.P. is a great honour in our democracy.

I still take an interest in legislation reflected in the Income Tax Act and in Canada's overall finances. This has been the focus of many of my letters to M.P.s in the past. There are many facets of our fiscal challenges in the current environment but I wish to reflect upon one particular concern I have at this time in a broader sense.

In reviewing the Prime Minister's December 16, 2021 mandate letter to the Finance Minister, I was particularly struck by the following mandate clause: "Introduce amendments to the *Income Tax Act* to make anti-abortion organizations that provide dishonest counselling to pregnant women about their rights and options ineligible for charitable status." The phrase "dishonest counselling" is I fear so open to subjective interpretation that the proverbial truck could be driven through it.

As a long-time member of many charitable organizations, I fully agree that no charity should be involved in dishonest practices. But why does the mandate letter propose to single out one particular group? I greatly fear this may be a further extension of the government's resistance to anti-abortion and faith-based groups such as was evident in the attestation required (and later withdrawn) for summer student grants in recent years.

There are different views in society as to when life begins. I have often bemoaned the fact that Canada is one of only a handful of countries (along with North Korea and Vietnam) that have no legislation pertaining to taking life *in utero*. Virtually all western countries have some legislation in that regard. That aside for the moment, it would be a huge blight on Canadian rights and freedoms if the government unfairly targets

organizations and individuals that are legitimate providers of significant support and encouragement both to pregnant women and their families, both before and after birth. Please provide assurance that an organization will not be labelled as dishonest simply because its view of life is different from members of the Canadian government.

In short, may I (and all Canadians) be assured that no charity will lose its charitable status simply because of its pro-life views.

I would greatly appreciate a favourable response to my letter from you and your colleagues even before the next Federal Budget is delivered. Thank you.

Consultation is Necessary

It is incumbent on you to establish a thorough and transparent consultation process that hears from stakeholders, especially the affected pro-life organizations, before the government considers revoking or prohibiting charitable status for a category of charities. Less serious matters are regularly the topic of consultation, from the disbursement quota to CRA guidance documents to political activities.

Conclusion

We ask that you clarify the terms used in the mandate letter and ask that you consult with those charities most directly targeted by the proposal before taking any further action.

Dear Hon. Minister Freeland and Hon. Minister Lebouthillier,

I am writing to ask you for two things: **clarity** and **consultation**. We also write to express a deep **concern**.

During the recent election campaign, your party made a promise to remove charitable status for “anti-abortion organizations (for example, Crisis Pregnancy Centres) that provide dishonest counselling to women about their rights and about the options available to them at all stages of pregnancy.”

We ask you first to clarify this statement and your intentions. Second, we ask you to invite stakeholders, which must include pro-life organizations, to participate in meaningful consultations before taking any other action on this campaign pledge.

Concern

I am deeply concerned with the assertions made in the pledge, specifically that pregnancy care centres are characterized as “dishonest,” and that charitable status should be linked to a particular belief or conscientious conviction.

No charity should be de-registered solely on the basis of a pro-life belief or conscience. This suggestion raises immediate and significant *Charter* and procedural fairness concerns. Likewise, no type of charity should have its work mischaracterized, or be labelled with an undefined allegation of dishonesty simply because its views are different than those of the current government.

Pregnancy care centres provide much-needed emotional and practical help to thousands of women in the form of accurate, evidence-based counselling which includes information about all options. For example, [Pregnancy Care Canada](#)’s primary resource provides medically accurate information about all available options, including abortion. It has been reviewed by health professionals including obstetricians, gynecologists, ethicists, and social workers.

Our concerns are based on a plain reading of this platform pledge. We are, however, requesting direct clarification to ensure we understand exactly your intention.

We do not support charities that conduct their activities in dishonest ways.

Point of Redundancy: Dishonesty is Already Addressed in the *Income Tax Act*

We also understand that problems of dishonesty are already addressed under the *Income Tax Act*. For example, charities that make false statements in circumstances that amount to culpable conduct (149.1(4.1)(c)) can lose charitable registration. Similarly, charities are prohibited from having directors, trustees, officers, or like officials who, among other things, have been convicted of crimes involving financial dishonesty (149.1(4.1)(e)).

These are examples of a standard of dishonesty applied with equal measure across the entire charitable sector. And, at least as far as making false statements is concerned, it is a high threshold to prove; it is a standard of culpable conduct, at least as high as gross negligence.

Consultation is Necessary

It is incumbent on you to establish a thorough and transparent consultation process that hears from stakeholders, including the affected organizations, in any consideration of revoking charitable status for a category of charities. Less serious matters are regularly the topic of consultation, from the disbursement quota to CRA guidance documents to political activities.

Any such consultation must account for, at minimum: legal concerns, including respect for guaranteed *Charter* freedoms; social concerns, including the impact on other charities, the charitable sector broadly, and the communities served by the charities at issue; and policy matters, including proposed implementation, procedural fairness, and sector-wide application.

Conclusion

We ask that you clarify terms as set out above. We also ask that you consult with those charities most directly targeted by this pledge, such as Pregnancy Care Canada, and before taking any action.

Thank you in advance for providing clarity and for engaging stakeholders such as on this matter.

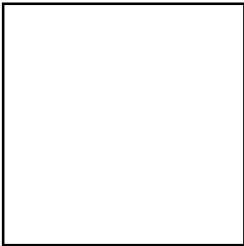

Dear Hon. Minister Freeland, Hon. Minister Lebouthillier, and Hon. Minister Ien,

RE: CHARITABLE STATUS

We represent a variety of independent organizations, including legal, religious and umbrella associations, all registered as charities. We are committed to implementing and promoting best practices in all areas of charity management, so as to promote honesty, trust, and transparency among our constituents and the public at large.

We understand that the Prime Minister's mandate letters instruct the Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Finance, and the Minister for Women and Gender Equality and Youth to introduce amendments to the Income Tax Act ("ITA") in order to "make anti-abortion organizations that provide dishonest counselling to pregnant women about their rights and options ineligible for charitable status" ("Mandate Letters").

Any proposal affecting eligibility for charitable status under the ITA must use precise language. As it stands, we find the Prime Minister's Mandate Letters troubling because of their vague assertions and unproven assumptions of dishonesty toward a specific subset of charities. We believe it is vital for the government to clearly define the terms, scope, and potential applications of this initiative, and to consider the long-term impact on the entire charitable sector before taking any type of punitive action against a targeted group of registered charities through legislative change. Revocation of charitable status is appropriately reserved for the most serious of circumstances, such as serious, deliberate or repeat non-compliance, and should always be substantiated by specific facts, not generalizations.

This proposal gives rise to another concern. By singling out a certain type of organization — based on its beliefs on a certain social issue — it appears to be motivated by ideological, and not just factual, considerations. The mandate does not, on its face, seek to address "dishonest counselling" generally, but only that which is allegedly provided by organizations with a certain worldview.

If an organization's charitable status can be placed at risk simply because its views or sincerely held beliefs are different than those of the government, **all charities are at risk**. Any category of charity could be deemed ineligible or be deregistered based on the particular views or priorities of any government. Charities should not be singled out for additional monitoring or audits simply

because they hold different views than those held by government; neither should their charitable status be placed in jeopardy.

At the outset, there are jurisdictional questions at issue. The Constitution Act, 1867 gives provinces exclusive jurisdiction to make laws in relation to the establishment, maintenance and management of charities. The federal government administers the *ITA*, under which charities must be registered to qualify for tax benefits. However, the *ITA* does not define what is charitable – that is left to the common law. Asserting that a particular viewpoint is “dishonest” does not make it so, nor does it alter the common law as to what qualifies as charitable.

To be abundantly clear, dishonest conduct is not acceptable; however, concerns of dishonesty are already addressed in the *ITA*. For example, charities that make false statements in circumstances that amount to culpable conduct can lose charitable registration (ss 149.1(4.1)(c), 168(1)(d), 188.1(9), 188.2(2)(f)). Similarly, charities are prohibited from having directors, trustees, officers, or like officials who, among other things, have been convicted of crimes involving financial dishonesty (s 149.1(1)). In addition, the application for charitable registration provides that “[t]his application for registration must be certified and submitted by one director, trustee or like official of the organization who has authority to sign on behalf of the organization. It is a serious offence under the *Income Tax Act* to provide false or deceptive information. The consequences of providing false or deceptive information may include revocation.”

Not only does the *ITA* already address dishonesty, it also permits charities to engage in public policy dialogue and development activities that further a charitable purpose. A charity may publicly agree or disagree with a decision or position of the government, and advocate to retain, oppose, or change a law, policy, or decision of any level of government.

We are concerned that the Mandate Letters from the Prime Minister risk silencing charities by removing charitable status for those that raise objections or support changes in law. Using vague language of “dishonesty” to remove charitable status for a subset of charities will deprive the public of their voices and perspectives in the public square, and marginalize those who support the charity. This is wrong. Charities are an essential part of civic society, regularly serving and speaking on behalf of marginalized and disadvantaged communities. Eliminating their voices and perspectives from public discourse will impoverish future policy decisions.

Further, charities have a right to effective freedom of expression.¹ Freedom of expression ensures that everyone can express their thoughts, opinions, and beliefs, however unpopular or contrary to the mainstream.² Freedom to fully and openly express views on social and political issues is fundamental to democracy, and restrictions that touch on the core of these issues raise concerns about the “dangers inherent in state censorship of such debate.”³

It also raises concerns about the “homogenization of private players” within a public space, that is, the charitable sector.⁴ The government itself must be neutral in regulating such spaces with regard to freedom of conscience and religion, in order to “preserve and promote the multicultural

heritage of Canadian society”.⁵ Requiring agreement with a certain set of views, beliefs or priorities before entering a public space (e.g. obtaining charitable status), undermines freedom to believe or not believe, imposes uniformity, and rejects diversity of thought and expression. Further, when a government targets charities for expressing views it disfavours, it sets a precedent for future governments to do the same against charities they, in turn, disfavour.

This is not an exhaustive list of concerns; however, it highlights several immediate issues. As such, we ask that you not move forward with these proposed amendments to the *ITA* before providing clarity and engaging in consultation with stakeholders, particularly those who are targeted by this proposed amendment.

As stakeholders, we respectfully ask for a meeting to further discuss our concerns. Any of the organizations below are also available for further comment on their own unique concerns. We thank you for your attention to this problem.

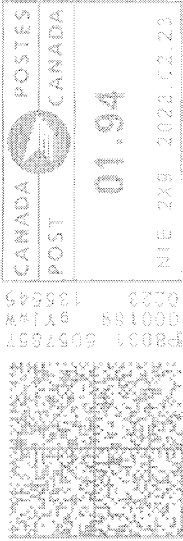

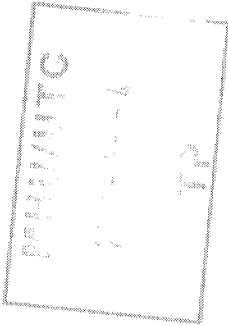

It seems women are allowed to freely choose abortion and the government is willing to applaud these decisions and help in ways to make this possible by supporting abortion support agencies but when a woman wants to seek other options (keeping her baby or adoption) like through a Pregnancy Care Centre and wants the ability to make decisions they feel are important to their situation in a time of a pregnancy this now becomes "dishonest counseling to pregnant women". Words of our own Prime Minister.

What does the government decide to do? Remove their charitable status. My guess is that those suggesting this decision have not set foot in a Pregnancy Care Centre or taken the time to learn what this agency all involves. If no one has it's a shame you feel you can make this decision. Have you personally talked to women who have used the services at a Centre? If the answer is also no that's another shame.

This decision to take away the charitable status is quite personal to me since without the availability of the Pregnancy Care Centre an unplanned pregnancy could have been much more devastating and scary. My daughter became pregnant at the age of 15. This was not an easy situation to go through. My daughter was adamant that she was keeping the child and the baby's father was in agreement. This was not solely a religious decision (Pregnancy Care Centres are not only used by religious sectors of the population in case you were not aware of that). Thankfully there was a Pregnancy Care Centre in our area and they walked my daughter through the difficult journey of being a teen parent whatever that looked like in her situation. They never pressured her to make any decisions. They listened, they supported and supplied her with items she needed. This was such a vital resource. My daughter was fortunate to have a family to also support her but not every person has that support system and the workers at these centres become that support. How can you think of taking this option away from those that need it so badly.

Hopefully you are also aware that if a woman has had an abortion and is struggling with that decision, Pregnancy Care Centre helps these women with an unbiased, non-judgemental setting and support staff.

Everyday there are girls/women who are confronted with tough decisions in regards to a pregnancy. The woman who chooses to abort her baby - her decision - should not have more government approved services than a woman who is struggling with the decision - also her decision - to keep her baby.

There is never a time that there should be the ability to take away any available services that can help a woman make a personal decision based on her choice.

Your government has a wrong impression of the Pregnancy Care Centres. Allowing women to make their own choices for themselves and the people they want to walk that journey with them is what a free democratic society is and people should be able to choose whichever services they are needing.

Which other charitable organizations will be next if this is allowed? Is this an attack on religion? On other organizations that don't meet the government's approval? Is abortion the only 'approved' choice? Shouldn't having a baby also be a choice? This is a fine line being crossed.

Please rethink the decision you are considering in regards to removing the charitable status of Pregnancy Care Centres in Canada.

I am reaching out as I am deeply upset about the governments threat that the CRA will no longer provide charitable status to anti-abortion organizations like Crisis Pregnancy centres claiming they provide “dishonest”counselling to women about their rights and about the options available to them at all stages of the pregnancy. To be taking the charitable status away from these organizations is a crime and a shame.

Your Honourable Crystia Freeland,

I am grateful for much of the work our government is doing for us, most recently it's response to the war in Ukraine. As one involved in helping Ukrainians in this time of great crisis, I strongly applaud that.

However, I wish to speak with you regarding another very pressing issue that is somewhat obscured by being embedded in the upcoming budget. It has come to my attention that a very vaguely worded but potentially disastrous platform promise has been mandated by our Prime Minister to be enacted through this budget.

The promise from "Forward For Everyone Platform - 2021/09" is on page 13, one bullet point among others under the heading of "A re-elected Liberal government will" reads:

"No longer provide charity status to anti-abortion organizations (for example, Crisis Pregnancy Centres) that provide dishonest counseling to women about their rights and about the options available to them at all stages of the pregnancy."

The vague wording of this promise is very troubling. Are all Crisis Pregnancy Centres deemed "anti-abortion" and painted by the same sweeping brushstroke? CPC's don't identify as "anti-abortion." Will there be a process that examines all facilities individually? Will a similar process be applied to all "pro-choice" to ensure they do not "provide dishonest counselling to women?" The implications of revoking charitable status to CPCs are not only devastating on the organizations themselves but most unfortunately on the people and communities they serve.

In Winnipeg, I have been on the centre's board and chaired that board for a time, my wife was a counsellor there for many years; I can attest that our centre in Winnipeg serves with integrity and in a truly altruistic manner. There is no dishonest counselling, the centre serves women no matter what they choose to do with a crisis pregnancy. In fact, in Winnipeg we may be the only facility providing post-abortion counselling for women and men struggling with PTSD after having chosen to abort an unwanted pregnancy. The centre does this without judgement with the desire to help those that are so often ignored and even discarded by the institutions and individuals that facilitated their abortion.

Among many other services, the centre also does much work in counselling families that have lost babies (still birth, miscarriage). The centre supports single mothers in a variety of meaningful and practical ways with absolutely no strings attached.

Because it's orientation and manner of operating is so pro-women, and altruistic (actually very pro-choice in that women are supported no matter what they choose), the only way that I could connect the Crisis Pregnancy Centre in Winnipeg to anything remotely "anti-abortion" is that it gives some people who do hold "anti-abortion" views a practical and worthy means to participate in helping their community in a society that does not always reflect their views on abortion. That is altruism if there ever was.

I also fear without these very healthy outlets of service, closing institutions like the CPC in Winnipeg will lead to radicalizing many moderates. I am sure you agree with me, no one wants that. The vagueness of the terms of this platform is guaranteed to bring legal challenge which most likely will stir up more legal challenges to Canada's current abortion legislation. Again, not an universal desired result, I am sure.

For those I speak for, I would like to know what the process of revocation of charitable status entails. If you cannot tell me, please let me know where I can get such information.

Also, I invite Mr. Lamoureux MP or any local Liberal MP to contact the Winnipeg CPC director Juergen Severloh at 204-782-0337. I know the centre is very open to transparency and appropriate visitors.

Thank you for your time in reading this. For the sake of vulnerable Canadians, I trust you will seriously reconsider this change to the budget and the charitable status of CPCs in Canada.

Dear Honourable Chrystia Freeland,

Not long ago I was watching a medical drama on tv. In the show, one of the key characters had a miscarriage. I was struck by the compassion and empathy the show's writers gave to this storyline, as they showed in detail the grief and pain the death of the woman's unborn baby left in her life and in her husband's life. In one of the very next episodes, however, another doctor goes into detail about being in favour of abortion, a simple medical procedure that should be an option for every woman.

The intellectual inconsistency in these two side-by-side storylines struck me: in one, an unborn baby dies and is mourned; in the next, a "fetus," said to not yet be a human, is "terminated" with no thought given to his or her life or to the consequences of that choice in the mother and father's life. There is something dishonest in the way these scenarios are presented.

Crisis pregnancy centres do not share this dishonest and intellectually irrational approach to pregnancy. They see an unborn baby as an unborn baby in both scenarios, after a miscarriage and after an abortions, and they support would-be mothers in both situations. They also support a woman, together with her family, whose baby dies after death (for example, through SIDS), or those women who choose to carry their pregnancies to term. They also support women who have chosen to have an abortion.

In the face of this intellectual honesty and the actual support crisis pregnancy centers offer to women without judgement and free of cost, I am confused and deeply disappointed, by how Prime Minister Trudeau can claim in his Mandate Letter of December 16, 2021 (<https://pm.gc.ca/en/mandate->

[letters/2021/12/16/deputy-prime-minister-and-minister-finance-mandate-letter](#)) that crisis pregnancy centers “provide dishonest counselling to women about their rights and about the options available to them at all stages of the pregnancy” and threaten to withdraw their charitable status on this basis.

In thinking about this idea of honesty or dishonesty, I looked up information about abortions at the Women's Health Centre in Winnipeg. Under the "FAQ" menu (<https://womenshealthclinic.org/what-we-do/abortion/aspiration-abortion-faqs/>), they answered the question "What is an aspiration abortion?" this way:

"An aspiration abortion is a procedure to end a pregnancy. A health care provider inserts instruments into the vagina and through the cervix to remove the contents of the uterus."

In calling out "dishonest information," I wonder how this description passed the Prime Minister's notice? For, while a French speaker might recognize the word "aspirateur" to be a vacuum cleaner, most English speakers would not know that this word means "to draw in or out using a sucking motion." Yet instead of explaining a word that likely most readers do not understand (this is the part of the website that should be answering questions, after all), the definition maintains vagueness on all fronts: it does not explain the term "aspiration," neither does not give any information on what kinds of "instruments" are inserted into the vagina, nor what kinds of "contents" are removed from the uterus. If a woman is to make a choice about her pregnancy, she needs to know all the information about her choices. This website gives the woman none of the information she needs, and yet our Prime Minister holds this up as "honesty"?

Not only does the website provide a misleading and intentionally vague definition of an aspiration abortion, under the question "Can I bring a person with me to my appointment?" we read this response:

"Due to the length of your appointment and the size of our waiting room, we ask that if someone brings you to your appointment, that they drop you off and return to pick you up once you are done. Additional people will not be allowed to accompany you through your appointment."

When we are discussing questions of honesty or dishonesty, I wonder how a statement like this passes the muster as well. While crisis pregnancy centres do not hide what they do and support a woman in a transparent way, women who choose to get abortions at the main medical clinic where they are available in Manitoba are made to do so entirely on their own, without even the support of a friend or family member throughout the process. Additionally, are we really meant to believe that this ban on having a support person beside her when a woman comes for an abortion is due to the physical size of the waiting room? I think it is appalling that, at a moment when a woman needs support and loving people around her the most, she is prevented from having this support network and instructed to be dropped off and picked up at the door as though this was a visit to the bank or a dentist appointment. It makes me wonder what happens inside the Women's Health Centre that no one but the vulnerable woman getting the abortion can know about it? What are they trying to hide and are they being up front and honest about what happens to the woman and her unborn baby when inside?

In contrast, consider this description from the website of the Crisis Pregnancy Centre in Winnipeg, which acknowledges that women in Canada have many options when it comes to their unborn child:

"Women have the legal right in Canada to seek and obtain an abortion. Women have the right to make moral choices about their own lives. At the Crisis Pregnancy Centre we fully understand this and believe this makes it imperative

that women also be given the right to all the available information regarding the impact that their decisions will have. Not to do so would be condescending and manipulative.

If a client of our centre obtains an abortion, we love her. If she carries-to-term, we love her. If she releases the child in an adoption, we love her. If she grieves after her abortion, with zero judgment, we will mourn with her. If she is in need during parenting, we will care for her. If she struggles after the adoption, we will support her."

(<https://pregnancy.ca/index.php/our-take/>)

There is certainly dishonesty and deception happening on the topic of abortions, but it is not coming from the crisis pregnancy centres who spell out, in detail, the services they provide and the women they support (everyone, no questions asked). It seems that in our world, and certainly in the mindset of the current Liberal government, the word "dishonest" is being applied in a dishonest way, not paying attention to its actual definition but simply being used when the party does not agree with the opinion held. I did not realise Canada is one of those countries where disagreeing with the government is becoming illegal.

Up until the last election I have always voted Liberal in federal elections. I voted for the current MP for my riding in St Boniface - St Vital, Dan Vandal, as recently as 2019. But the Liberal Party has lost my support over the way it is coming down on people, organizations, democratic and religious freedom, and opinions with which it does not agree. This governance is not in the best interests of our country and I do not support it.

I am writing to you as a Canadian citizen to ask you to not to introduce amendements to the *Income Tax Act* that would revoke the charitable status of organizations that support a pro-life position, like crisis pregnancy centres. I ask that you continue to allow organizations like these to continue their good work in supporting women during difficult times. I ask that you continue to allow Canada to be a democracy and not crack down on organizations like these simply because you do not agree with them.

We were very concerned when we saw an intent from the Liberal party platform in 2021 to change the charitable status of “pro-life” pregnancy help centers, on the basis of providing “dishonest counseling to pregnant women”. Our concerns have only mounted, since this has been addressed in the your mandate letter to the Finance Minister. She has been instructed to make changes to the Income Tax Act, so “that anti-abortion organizations that provide dishonest counseling to pregnant women” are ineligible for charitable status”.

Canada is a large and diverse country full of different beliefs. I will never believe that abortion is moral and right, just because it is legal. But to have pregnancy help centers singled out and threatened because their beliefs are different from the federal government's beliefs is incredibly threatening to religious freedom and the ability to hold different points of view in Canada.

We have been supporters of our local pregnancy support center for many years. Their stated goals are to bring hope and healing to women and families who need support with pregnancy and parenting. They know that every life has value, and come alongside both women and families to provide practical support and encouragement. They love all the people who come through their doors, not just the ones who believe the same as they do. They counsel women and men who have experienced abortion, as well as support women who choose to carry their pregnancies to term.

On a personal note, I want to express why I so strongly believe that abortion is

wrong. I believe life starts at conception, and should end at natural death. »

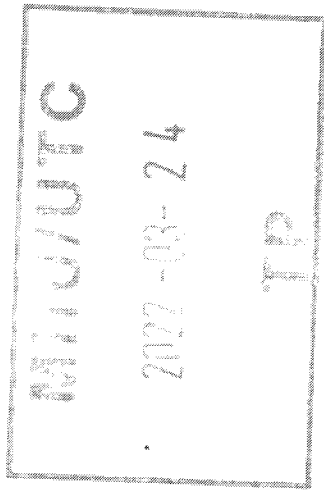
It is a great shame if we suppress this very natural and easy to see truth about life in the womb. It is not "dishonest counseling" if the truth is being told. People might not like the truth, but it does not make it any less true. It is a great shame how many children are killed through abortion each year in Canada. I lost 4 children through the sorrow of miscarriage, and often wonder who they would have turned into if my pregnancies had gone full term. Who have we lost in Canada through abortion- future doctors, scientists, farmers and teachers, our next generation of mothers and fathers, each a precious individual. We have lost much in Canada through the devaluing of life that has occurred, based only on whether or not the child is wanted- as if that is the only criteria for a life's value.

We are very concerned that the government is going to single out groups because of their views on abortion and when life begins. Canadians have different beliefs about abortion, and we need to be able to disagree with the government in order to have a healthy democracy, not be punished.

Please do all that you can to ensure that no charity loses its charitable status solely because of pro-life beliefs. We will be interested in knowing what steps you can take to make sure that freedom will continued to be supported for all Canadians.

I understand that the Prime Minister's mandate letter instructs the Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Finance to change the *Income Tax Act* so that "anti-abortion organizations that provide dishonest counseling to pregnant women about their rights and options" are ineligible for charitable status.

In our opinion, the proposal will create a potentially vague and arbitrary standard. The phrase "dishonest counselling" is not currently used in any Act or regulation in Canada. Based on a legal opinion [REDACTED] has received, the phrase has no legally certain meaning and could be open to abuse and a legal challenge. Finally, if the proposal were to proceed, then it should be aimed at all organizations that provide abortion counselling. We hope that all organizations dealing with this sensitive issue will act appropriately. But it is also possible for an organization that promotes abortions to provide "dishonest counsel." To have a provision aimed at only one side of the issue could leave the provision open to a legal challenge and possible violation of the *Charter*. Some thought must also be given respecting who is to make the decision whether counsel has been dishonest and how evidence for the decision is to be gathered. It would be better to have the courts involved in making this decision as it does not seem that the Department of Finance has expertise in this area.

Dear Minister Freeland,

We are writing to update you with our concerns with specific provisions of the Budget Implementation Act, 2022 ("BIA") intended to enable registered charities to partner more effectively with non-qualified donees while still ensuring proper accountability. We echo the concerns and recommendations of Cooperation Canada, Imagine Canada, the Philanthropic Foundations of Canada, and the legal profession.

We admire the Government of Canada for championing this issue and committing in Budget 2022 to implement the spirit of Bill S-216. However, the current wording of the BIA would not only fail to implement Bill S-216's spirit, thereby preventing the creation of new partnerships due to cumbersome and inflexible regulation, but it would also fail to include shared platforms in this important reform and fail to recognize funding techniques used by municipalities and government agencies.

In general, a minimum of language from Bill S-216 must be included in the Budget Implementation Act 1 (Bill C19) text in order for it to be effective in addressing these concerns. We strongly urge that the BIA, at minimum, be amended to:

- Refine the proposed definition of 'qualifying disbursement,' section 149.1(1). Remove the reference to disbursement meeting 'prescribed conditions' and replace it with a requirement that the charity instead takes reasonable steps to ensure that the resources disburses are used exclusively in furtherance of a charitable purpose.
- Delete proposed Regulation 3703 in its entirety. This would allow for regulations to be in the CRA guidance documents rather than exist as codified rules in the Income Tax Act.
- Amend language related to 'directed giving,' paragraph 168(1)(f).

We express deep concern, particularly for the proposed changes to s.168(1)(f) in the BIA, and we highly recommend they be amended. The proposed changes to s.168(1)(f) would prohibit partnerships where charities are meeting the standards of a qualifying disbursement but are working with a non-qualified donee that the donor or funder specifically supports. This would prohibit all kinds of legitimate partnerships.

My apologies for the confusion.

I saw our branch had some active folders and accepted.

I asked for clarification from our Charities Directorate as to when CRA responds and when its redirected to DoF, this is the explanation:

The CRA is still waiting for direction from the Department of Finance on the Liberal Electoral 2021 campaign promise to no longer provide charity status to anti-abortion organizations (for example, Crisis Pregnancy Centres) that provide dishonest counseling to women about their rights and about the options available to them at all stages of the pregnancy.

Until we receive direction, the Charities Directorate is not commenting on the electoral campaign promise.

So, what we have been doing with MinMails is when the incoming is a 2-line email where the writer expresses their opinion on the promise (agree with it or disagree with it), and there's no expectation of a reply, we've been closing it with a Memo to File.

However, when the incoming is asking questions about the promise (ie what misinformation, what dishonest counselling, whether the provisions are to be applied to all charitable organizations or only those organizations with particular underlying beliefs about when life begins), we are asking for a transfer to Department of Finance since the direction the CRA will take must be provided by DoF.

I am writing to express my deep concern and ask for clarification. The Liberal Party platform, "Forward For Everyone", stated that a re-elected Liberal government will "No longer provide charity status to anti-abortion organizations (for example, Crisis Pregnancy Centres) that provide dishonest counseling to women about their rights and about the options available to them at all stages of the pregnancy."

Given the context of the Canada Summer Jobs attestation, I am very concerned at the idea that participation in the public square and a level playing field with respect to government programs could be conditional on acceptance of a particular view of abortion; in essence, subject to a values test.

If there is such a significant review of charitable status, there would need to be answers to basic questions such as

- * what is considered "dishonest counseling,"
- * what mechanism would identify dishonesty,
- * whether the provisions are to be applied to all charitable organizations or only those organizations with particular underlying beliefs about when life begins,
- * and how this would be carried out in compliance with Charter protections.

I am also concerned by the mischaracterization implicit in the platform statement. Pregnancy care centres are a source of support for many Canadian women. Pregnancy Care Canada (PCC) is a best practice association of over 80 pregnancy care centres. These PCC centres exist to provide a safe environment for women to make pregnancy decisions that are fully informed, evidence-based, consistent with their belief system and free from external influences. They respect a woman's right to make her own decision and seek to provide her with medically accurate information on abortion, adoption and parenting.

A democracy such as Canada. is founded on the premise that diverse beliefs will be respected and accommodated. Any endeavor to revoke charitable status on the basis of beliefs about abortion would seem to risk violating Charter guarantees of freedom of conscience, religion, thought, belief, opinion and expression, and as well, specifically minimizing the rights of women.

It was with alarm and deep concern that I read the Federal government proposes to “... *no longer provide charity status to anti-abortion organizations (for example, Crisis Pregnancy Centres) that provide dishonest counseling to women about their rights and about the options available to them at all stages of the pregnancy.*”

Pregnancy care centres have been unjustly targeted in this statement. These centres provide much-needed emotional and practical help to thousands of vulnerable women, expectant women, and new mothers and their families in the form of accurate, evidence-based counselling which includes information on all options; post-abortion care; nutrition and prenatal classes; and necessities such as cribs, strollers, baby food, clothing, and more. These exemplary organizations are committed to ensuring that each woman is empowered and treated with dignity, compassion and respect, regardless of her decisions. Pregnancy care centres exist to provide a safe environment for women to make pregnancy decisions that are fully informed, evidence-based, consistent with their belief system and free from external influences. They respect a woman's right to make her own decision and seek to provide her with medically accurate information on abortion, adoption and parenting. Considering the measurable financial and social benefits provided by charities of this kind, revoking charitable status to this type of organization would be a profound loss to Canadians.

Historically, charitable status has been based on recognition of public benefit. This election platform would, instead, make charitable status dependent on political favour. In other words, politics has now moved into charity regulation in a big way.

Rather than destroy the good work of charitable organizations, all political parties, candidates, and indeed the entire Canadian population, should be aware of the great work our charities do for the common good of Canada. And what a financial benefit this is to the government as well.

I fully agree that if any charitable organization provides dishonest counselling, it should lose its charitable status. But only if this can be factually or objectively established... simply providing accurate and factual pregnancy care supportive counselling does not establish “dishonest counselling”.

From my research and reading, I do not find evidence of pro-choice organizations being at risk of losing their charitable status, and in fact, are being supported by the government. Advocating for only one perspective could be termed “dishonest counselling”.

A liberal democracy such as Canada is founded on the premise that diverse beliefs will be respected and accommodated. An endeavor to revoke charitable status on the basis of beliefs, especially when those beliefs include presenting/supporting all options, would seem to risk violating *Charter* guarantees of freedom of conscience, religion, thought, belief, opinion and expression.

I urge that any policy proposals that would deny charitable status to the pregnancy care centres be reconsidered and revoked.

RE: CHARITABLE STATUS

We represent a variety of independent organizations, including legal, religious and umbrella associations, all registered as charities. We are committed to implementing and promoting best practices in all areas of charity management, so as to promote honesty, trust, and transparency among our constituents and the public at large.

We understand that the Prime Minister's mandate letters instruct the Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Finance, and the Minister for Women and Gender Equality and Youth to introduce amendments to the Income Tax Act ("ITA") in order to "make anti-abortion organizations that provide dishonest counselling to pregnant women about their rights and options ineligible for charitable status" ("Mandate Letters").

Any proposal affecting eligibility for charitable status under the *ITA* must use precise language. As it stands, we find the Prime Minister's Mandate Letters troubling because of their vague assertions and unproven assumptions of dishonesty toward a specific subset of charities. We believe it is vital for the government to clearly define the terms, scope, and potential applications of this initiative, and to consider the long-term impact on the entire charitable sector before taking any type of punitive action against a targeted group of registered charities through legislative change. Revocation of charitable status is appropriately reserved for the most serious of circumstances, such as serious, deliberate or repeat non-compliance, and should always be substantiated by specific facts, not generalizations.

This proposal gives rise to another concern. By singling out a certain type of organization — based on its beliefs on a certain social issue — it appears to be motivated by ideological, and not just factual, considerations. The mandate does not, on its face, seek to address "dishonest counselling" generally, but only that which is allegedly provided by organizations with a certain worldview.

If an organization's charitable status can be placed at risk simply because its views or sincerely held beliefs are different than those of the government, **all charities are at risk**. Any category of charity could be deemed ineligible or be deregistered based on the particular views or priorities of any government. Charities should not be singled out for additional monitoring or audits simply

because they hold different views than those held by government; neither should their charitable status be placed in jeopardy.

At the outset, there are jurisdictional questions at issue. The Constitution Act, 1867 gives provinces exclusive jurisdiction to make laws in relation to the establishment, maintenance and management of charities. The federal government administers the *ITA*, under which charities must be registered to qualify for tax benefits. However, the *ITA* does not define what is charitable – that is left to the common law. Asserting that a particular viewpoint is “dishonest” does not make it so, nor does it alter the common law as to what qualifies as charitable.

To be abundantly clear, dishonest conduct is not acceptable; however, concerns of dishonesty are already addressed in the *ITA*. For example, charities that make false statements in circumstances that amount to culpable conduct can lose charitable registration (ss 149.1(4.1)(c), 168(1)(d), 188.1(9), 188.2(2)(f)). Similarly, charities are prohibited from having directors, trustees, officers, or like officials who, among other things, have been convicted of crimes involving financial dishonesty (s 149.1(1)). In addition, the application for charitable registration provides that “[t]his application for registration must be certified and submitted by one director, trustee or like official of the organization who has authority to sign on behalf of the organization. It is a serious offence under the *Income Tax Act* to provide false or deceptive information. The consequences of providing false or deceptive information may include revocation.”

Not only does the *ITA* already address dishonesty, it also permits charities to engage in public policy dialogue and development activities that further a charitable purpose. A charity may publicly agree or disagree with a decision or position of the government, and advocate to retain, oppose, or change a law, policy, or decision of any level of government.

We are concerned that the Mandate Letters from the Prime Minister risk silencing charities by removing charitable status for those that raise objections or support changes in law. Using vague language of “dishonesty” to remove charitable status for a subset of charities will deprive the public of their voices and perspectives in the public square, and marginalize those who support the charity. This is wrong. Charities are an essential part of civic society, regularly serving and speaking on behalf of marginalized and disadvantaged communities. Eliminating their voices and perspectives from public discourse will impoverish future policy decisions.

Further, charities have a right to effective freedom of expression.¹ Freedom of expression ensures that everyone can express their thoughts, opinions, and beliefs, however unpopular or contrary to the mainstream.² Freedom to fully and openly express views on social and political issues is fundamental to democracy, and restrictions that touch on the core of these issues raise concerns about the “dangers inherent in state censorship of such debate.”³

It also raises concerns about the “homogenization of private players” within a public space, that is, the charitable sector.⁴ The government itself must be neutral in regulating such spaces with regard to freedom of conscience and religion, in order to “preserve and promote the multicultural

heritage of Canadian society”.⁵ Requiring agreement with a certain set of views, beliefs or priorities before entering a public space (e.g. obtaining charitable status), undermines freedom to believe or not believe, imposes uniformity, and rejects diversity of thought and expression. Further, when a government targets charities for expressing views it disfavours, it sets a precedent for future governments to do the same against charities they, in turn, disfavour.

This is not an exhaustive list of concerns; however, it highlights several immediate issues. As such, we ask that you not move forward with these proposed amendments to the *ITA* before providing clarity and engaging in consultation with stakeholders, particularly those who are targeted by this proposed amendment.

As stakeholders, we respectfully ask for a meeting to further discuss our concerns. Any of the organizations below are also available for further comment on their own unique concerns. We thank you for your attention to this problem.

Thank you for serving our communities and country in your capacity as a Cabinet Minister.

I am a private citizen, with memberships in many charitable organizations.

I understand that the Prime Minister's [mandate letter](#) instructs the Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Finance to change the *Income Tax Act* so that "anti-abortion organizations that provide dishonest counseling to pregnant women about their rights and options" are ineligible for charitable status.

I'm very concerned about this proposal for a number of reasons.

If an organization's charitable status can be put at risk simply because its views are different from those of the government, all charities are at risk. It means that every time the government adopts a new view or political priority, or any time a new government is elected, charitable status for specific groups will be in jeopardy.

No category of charity should be targeted for deregistration, singled out for more audits, or subject to additional monitoring based on whether or not its views align with those of the government.

To be clear, I agree that charities shouldn't be involved in dishonest practices. But dishonest conduct by charities is already addressed by the law in other ways.

I'm also very concerned that this approach risks silencing any charity that objects to or supports changes in the law, positions they are allowed to take. Canadians hold a wide variety of views on all sorts of issues. That diversity is rightly reflected in the charitable sector. Expressing diverse views, especially on social and political issues, is fundamental to a democratic society. Charities are no exception.

Please do not implement the proposed changes. They would set a dangerous precedent and put all charities at risk.

Thank you for serving our communities and country in your capacity as a Cabinet Minister.

I understand that the Prime Minister's mandate letter instructs the Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Finance to change the *Income Tax Act* so that "anti-abortion organizations that provide dishonest counseling to pregnant women about their rights and options" are ineligible for charitable status.

I'm very concerned about this proposal for a number of reasons.

If an organization's charitable status can be put at risk simply because its views are different than those of the government, all charities are at risk. It means that every time the government adopts a new view or political priority, or any time a new government is elected, charitable status for specific groups will be in jeopardy.

No category of charity should be targeted for deregistration, singled out for more audits, or subject to additional monitoring based on whether or not its views align with those of the government.

To be clear, I agree that charities shouldn't be involved in dishonest practices. But dishonest conduct by charities is already addressed by the law in other ways.

I'm also very concerned that this approach risks silencing any charity that objects to or supports changes in the law, positions they are allowed to take. Canadians hold a wide variety of views on all sorts of issues. That diversity is rightly reflected in the charitable sector. Expressing diverse views, especially on social and political issues, is fundamental to a democratic society. Charities are no exception.

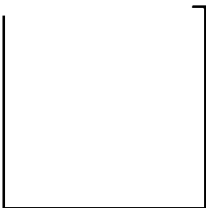

This past weekend, I received news that the Crisis Pregnancy Centre of Winnipeg will no longer be considered a charitable organization in Canada. Upon further investigation into what this means and why such an action would take place, I feel that I strongly disagree with the decision. As a young woman living in Winnipeg, I feel comfortable and cared for knowing that if I ever needed pregnancy counselling services, the Crisis Pregnancy Centre would be there as an option for support. However, if their charitable status is revoked, the financial ramifications to the charity would be extreme, and I may not have the same access to their facility that I could have.

In the “Forward for Everyone” Liberal Platform for 2021, it was stated that, *“Everyone in Canada should have the information they need to freely make decisions over their own bodies and have access to the medical care and services that are their legal rights.”* The Crisis Centre of Winnipeg does not compromise this admirable value in any way. Further, in this same document, it is stated that the Crisis Pregnancy Centre provides *“dishonest counselling”* to women. I find this statement to be an appalling generalization. The Crisis Centre of Winnipeg acknowledges that women have legal access to abortion. Further, they will provide support to anyone who chooses to exercise that option. However, they also believe that, *“Women have the right to make moral choices about their own lives.”* In order to plan for the choice they want to make, women need to have all their options clarified for them. Abortion is an option, yes – but not an all-encompassing choice for every pregnant individual.

Further, it seems that in the process of penalizing “anti-choice organizations”, the Government of Canada is willing to cut off access to free counseling, practical support (diaper, formula, furniture provision), as well as grief counseling to women who have not only chosen to have an abortion, but also women who have had a miscarriage. In your decision to advertise the Crisis Pregnancy Center as an “anti-choice organization”, you have demonstrated incredible oversight. I can’t help but wonder - Was any research done at all, to determine this decision? My research

into the Crisis Centre's goals and values was not intensive, and yet it seems that there is much information which was not considered. Respectfully, it seems that a decision was made with poor judgment, in order to fulfill a political promise.

I feel incredibly unsafe knowing that I, a | , could one day not have access to all the information I need, in order to make an informed decision for my body and my life. Where else can I find these services in Winnipeg? Where is the free grief counselling if I experience a miscarriage? Where can I find free counselling if I decide to have an abortion? Where can I recommend other women in my life go to for information on pregnancy, adoption, abortion, and the support services which are offered to them?

Thank-you for all the work you do to support our country, as the Minister of Finance and Deputy Prime Minister. I applaud you for your service and implore that in the future, more time is spent researching the decisions made in this department.

Thank you for serving our communities and country in your capacity as a Cabinet Minister.

Personally and from our business we support many charities, from local food banks/resource centres to humanitarian organizations that reach the under privileged around the world.

I have heard that the Prime Minister's mandate letter to you, the Finance Minister, instructs you to make changes to the *Income Tax Act* so that "anti-abortion organizations that provide dishonest counseling to pregnant women" are not eligible for charitable status.

There are several points in his letter that are very concerning.

First I would agree to the extent but clarify that there should be no dishonest 'practices' in any charity. But this has already been dealt within the existing laws and regulations.

He uses the word 'anti-abortion organization' and then states for example 'crisis pregnancy centres'.

I am concerned that this government is going to single out groups because of their views on abortion and when life begins. I'm also very concerned that an organization could be labelled as dishonest simply because its views on abortion and when life begins differ from this government's views.

Please make sure this does not happen.

Using crisis pregnancy centre as an example gives the impression that all crisis pregnancy centres are anti-abortion when many of them are not political activist but are loving, caring people that provide counsel and care for a widely diverse group of women and families that find themselves in difficult situations. I would encourage you to check out The Pregnancy Centre in Kitchener as one example.

I am concerned with who or what will determine the basis of 'dishonest counselling'. This appears to be very vague, similar to the conversion therapy dialogue that took place not too long ago.

If an organization's charitable status can be put at risk simply because its views are different than those of the government, all charities are at risk. It means that every time the government adopts a new view or political priority, or any time a new government is elected, charitable status for specific groups will be in jeopardy.

No category of charity should be targeted for de-registration, singled out for more audits, or subject to additional monitoring based on whether or not its views align with those of the government.

This reminds me of the Canada Summer Jobs attestation. I don't want to see Canada use this kind of values test.

I'm also very concerned that this approach risks silencing any charity that objects to or supports changes in the law, positions they are allowed to take. Canadians hold a wide variety of views on all sorts of issues. That diversity is rightly reflected in the charitable sector. CHARITABLE STATUS: KEY ISSUES

All charities are at risk

If an organization's charitable status is at risk simply because its views or beliefs are different than those of the government, all charities are at risk. It means that every time the government adopts a new view or political priority, or any time a new government is elected, charitable status for specific groups will be in jeopardy.

Dishonesty is already addressed in the *Income Tax Act (ITA)*

Charities that make false statements in circumstances that amount to culpable conduct (s 149.1(4.1)(c), 168(1)(d) /ITA) can lose charitable registration. Similarly, charities are prohibited from having directors, trustees, officers or like officials who, among other things, have been convicted of crimes involving financial dishonesty (s 149.1(1)).

Diversity is rightly reflected in the charitable sector

Canada is a diverse and pluralistic nation. Its diversity is represented in many ways, including through the diversity of charitable organizations. When it comes to all matters of conscience, belief, and non-belief it is incumbent on the government to neither "favour nor hinder any particular belief, and the same holds true for non-belief."¹

Mischaracterizing charities is wrong

No category of charity should have its work mischaracterized or be labelled as dishonest simply because its views or beliefs are different than those of the current government. Similarly, no category of charity should be singled out for disproportionate numbers of audits or monitoring simply because it holds certain views or beliefs, whether about religion, the environment or other matters, that differ from the government.

Donors must have free choice

Charities rely on donations from Canadians to fund their charitable activities. Canadians are motivated to donate for a variety of reasons, both personal and ideological; for example, being personally affected or believing in a particular cause.² Charities function as part of Canada's civic core – other-centered, pro-social, pursuing goals beneficial to the community. Donors ought to have free choice in where and how to build that civic core.

Charities can oppose laws, policies and decisions of government

Charities must use all of their resources for charitable activities. [Public policy dialogue and development activities](#) are charitable when they further a charitable purpose (advancing education, advancing religion, relieving poverty, etc.). A charity may publicly agree or disagree with a decision or position of the government. A charity may advocate to retain, oppose, or change a law, policy or decision, of any level of government.

CHARITABLE STATUS: KEY ISSUES

Freedom of expression is at risk

Free expression ensures that everyone can express their thoughts, opinions, and beliefs, however unpopular or contrary to the mainstream.³ Freedom to fully and openly express views on social and political issues is fundamental to democracy and therefore to all other *Charter* rights and freedoms. Restrictions that touch the core of social and political issues raise concerns about the “dangers inherent in state censorship of such debate.”⁴

Targeting charities on the basis of their views or beliefs undermines state neutrality

The government must preserve a neutral public space where there is “true freedom to believe or not to believe.” Neutrality does not mean “the homogenization of private players in that space.” Rather, neutral public spaces “preserve and promote the multicultural heritage of Canadian society.”⁵

Targeting a subsection of charities for de-registration on the basis of its views is wrong and violates the principle of state neutrality. Demanding agreement with a certain set of priorities or views before entry into a ‘neutral’ space undermines freedom to believe or not to believe, imposes uniformity, and rejects diversity of thought and expression.

I am writing to express my concerns about the Liberal Party's proposal to revoke the charity status of Crisis Pregnancy Centres (CPCs) in Canada.

These centres provide a great service to and are a great resource for families in crisis. The CPC in my city (Winnipeg) is intentionally located in an area that is economically depressed, in the inner city, has a dense population of both indigent and low-functioning individuals and families, and has crime rates 91% higher than the national average, and 113% higher for violent crimes. As you can well imagine, there is no shortage of individuals and families in crisis in the area, but the Centre reaches people from as far away as Regina and Thunder Bay as well.

The following statement is from *Forward. For Everyone.*:

A re-elected Liberal government will:

No longer provide charity status to anti-abortion organizations (for example, Crisis Pregnancy Centres) that provide dishonest counseling to women about their rights and about the options available to them at all stages of the pregnancy.

To provide dishonest counseling would be completely contrary to the mandate set out by CPCs. To quote Juergen Severloh, executive director of the CPC in Winnipeg,

This is precisely why we developed the PCC [Pregnancy Care Canada], to ensure that affiliated centres would hold to the highest standards. Ensuring that every affiliated CPC would have policies, processes, and materials that were up-to-date, accurate, and truthful. The PCC has year-round workshops and webinars that ensure the highest level of training. Furthermore, annually, every affiliated centre has to affirm and comply with a rigorous set of standards. The PCC is restrictive in its affiliation, and not every pregnancy centre in Canada is allowed to be affiliated.

Dear Honourable Member of Parliament and Ministers,

I am a constituent of Winnipeg South Centre, in Manitoba.
Thank you for all the work you are doing on behalf of your constituents in Ottawa.
The work you are doing is important, and not always easy - and I want to thank you for it.

The matter regarding which I am writing today is the potential loss of charitable status for the Crisis Pregnancy Centre in Winnipeg. I am deeply saddened to hear about this proposed change.
Winnipeg has a large population of structurally disadvantaged individuals, and women from a disadvantaged background are more likely to have multiple barriers stacked against them - poverty, addictions, poor mental health, domestic violence, etc.
In the instance of an unwanted pregnancy, I believe it is important for women to have multiple options available to them.
Abortion is one option, but it shouldn't be the only option that is available to structurally disadvantaged women.

Crisis Pregnancy Centre offers non-judgemental counselling, and supports for women who are dealing with an unwanted pregnancy. They offer a valuable option for many women, who feel overwhelmed and unable to keep their pregnancy for financial or psychosocial reasons. Letting them keep their charitable status would allow them to continue to provide this alternative to women who need supports to keep their pregnancy.
Women who come from a more privileged background rarely need to seek the help of organizations such as Crisis Pregnancy Centre.

My argument and plea for Crisis Pregnancy Centre to keep their charitable status is based on three principles - 1. Equity - Organizations such as Crisis Pregnancy Centre provide a valuable, safe, and non-judgmental space for disadvantaged women who want to keep their pregnancies. They provide basic material needs, such as diapers, and formula, infant and

maternity clothes, that go a long way to make women feel supported and empowered. To take that option away, disproportionately affects the most disadvantaged groups of women in Winnipeg.

2. Compassion - The women who access Crisis Pregnancy Centre are in a crisis point in their lives. The non-judgemental, supportive, listening ears that are available through this organization to women who desperately need someone to talk to, without feeling judged or coerced, is worth every dollar. No matter what our political backgrounds, I believe the Canadian government to be one that is inherently compassionate, and the move to strip this organization of their charitable status, seems much at odds with the nature and values of our society.

3. Tolerance - No matter what our views on abortion, I believe as a mom, that every woman deserves the opportunity to feel supported in their pregnancy. The existence of Crisis Response Centre in Winnipeg, provides exactly that. It does not threaten or take away access to abortion services in Winnipeg. But, it provides support for women who are seeking an alternative to abortion.

Coming back to privilege, this does not affect women who are well-to-do. And I believe, options should be available not just for the well-to-do.

Our Board of Directors wishes to encourage you to exercise significant caution before proceeding with the part of your mandate letter which encourages you to:

Introduce amendments to the *Income Tax Act* to make anti-abortion organizations that provide dishonest counselling to pregnant women about their rights and options ineligible for charitable status, . . .

We believe that naming one type of organization and seeking to restrict their ability to become registered charities could create a very unfortunate precedent. Moreover, we think that there already exist powers to prevent or remove the registration of organizations that are dishonest.

We have, however, had recent experience with people alleging charities are dishonest and should lose their charitable status. You are no doubt aware that the Alberta government used its powers under the Public Inquiries Act to try to silence environmental charities on the grounds that they were dishonest and that they were significantly funded by people and organizations outside Canada. The resulting report, despite any number of flaws, gave up trying to judge the claim about dishonesty, and provided no evidence of wrongdoing by any charity.

Nonetheless, the process itself and the final report were polarizing and created reputational damage for charities as a whole. We would not want to see this repeated at the federal level.

Of note, in his report, the commissioner who headed the inquiry conceded that he was not in a position to determine whether allegations of dishonesty were true or not. In part, this was because many of the challenged statements were opinions. People and charities are entitled to have different opinions, and there can be debates as to whether something is dishonest information or an opinion. That debate might be of interest to a student of philosophy; it would be less illuminating as a matter of charity law.

We fear that the type of amendment suggested in the mandate letter could create far more harm than good. It is entirely possible that people will begin to point fingers at other types of charities and suggest they are being dishonest. Imagine, if you will, the implications of some future government proposing to prevent charitable registration of environmental organizations on the basis that they were providing dishonest information about pollution, or educational organizations on the basis that they were teaching critical race theory (a debate currently ongoing in the United States).

We believe that existing common law allows the Canada Revenue Agency to refuse registration to any charity that is not providing a public benefit. Dishonest behaviour on factual matters – as opposed to matters of opinion – clearly would raise concerns about whether an organization met the public-benefit test. There is no need to mention one type of organization; in fact, there is much potential harm in doing so, especially since, as we understand it, there already exists (unpublished) guidance within the Charities Directorate that speaks specifically to this issue.

Moreover, the type of amendment that is proposed could well be counterproductive. It is not beyond the realm of possibility that an organization refused registration would file an appeal, forcing the courts to spend considerable time determining whether claims of dishonesty were made out or not. As you must also be aware, this type of amendment is almost certain to result in a Charter challenge. We can think of few things that are more likely to lead to significant polarization, and have spill-over effects on all types of charities.

When your government was first elected in 2015, it promised to end what it called the political harassment of charities through the Political Activities Audit Project that had been initiated by the predecessor government. That promise was kept. We fear that the proposed amendment would become simply another side of the same coin.

We encourage you, and the government, to abandon this proposal, and allow CRA to apply existing law to deal with any organizations that seek to misuse charitable status.

They do, however, need the listening ear, encouragement and counsel that these centers provide. Please do not take this resource away from them in their time of crises.

Monsieur le Premier Ministre,

En décembre, vous avez demandé au ministère des Finances la révision du statut d'organisme de charité des Crisis Pregnancy Centres, des centres à but non lucratif qui offrent, notamment, des ressources aux femmes enceintes sans offrir de services liés à l'avortement. Avec respect, je vous invite à reconsidérer une révision basée principalement sur le critère de la position d'un organisme sur l'avortement parce qu'elle limite l'offre de services aux femmes et leurs options plutôt que de les accroître.

Pour pouvoir prendre une décision librement, choisir en toute liberté, il faut avoir les moyens de choisir les différentes options. Au Canada, l'un des nombreux choix offerts aux femmes enceintes est celui de donner naissance à leur enfant. S'il existe certains « Crisis Pregnancy Centre » dont certaines pratiques ont pu laisser à désirer, ce n'est pas le cas de tous. Par exemple, celui situé au centre-ville de Winnipeg indique clairement sa position sur l'avortement dans ses premiers contacts avec les femmes et les familles qui font appel à ses services. (Voir l'annexe, en anglais seulement.) Cette franchise permet à ces dernières de faire un choix éclairé et de déterminer si l'organisme correspond à l'objet de leurs recherches. De plus, une femme pourrait désirer recevoir l'appui d'un organisme qui croit au respect de la vie dès la conception. Convaincue que les femmes ont besoin de plus d'options que moins, je trouve inadmissible que le seul critère d'être contre l'avortement puisse constituer un motif suffisant pour retirer le statut d'organisme de charité d'une entité et entraîner sa dissolution.

Par ailleurs, croire ou ne pas croire en la moralité de l'avortement ne constitue pas un critère qui détermine si le personnel respecte ou non le droit et la capacité d'une personne à prendre la meilleure décision. L'offre de counseling de qualité dépend de multiples facteurs. Dans une organisation d'aide qui s'affiche en faveur de l'avortement, des membres du personnel pourraient insister sur l'avortement en minimisant ou en ne mentionnant pas les autres options. Être en faveur de l'avortement et en faire la promotion n'est pas nécessairement synonyme d'offrir plus d'options et de liberté aux femmes. Tant par une personne préconisant l'avortement qu'une autre défendant le respect de la vie dès la conception peut choisir de manipuler une personne vulnérable.

De plus, la focalisation sur la position de l'organisme en matière de respect de la vie éclipse les nombreux autres services offerts. Je ne peux pas me prononcer sur la situation chaque « Crisis Pregnancy Centres ». Toutefois, si l'on prend l'exemple de celui de Winnipeg, l'offre de services inclut l'accompagnement de parents qui ont perdu un bébé et la fourniture d'articles pour bébé. De fait, en 2020, environ 75 % de ses services consistent à fournir aux clientes des vêtements de maternité, du linge pour bébés, des couches, du lait maternisé, et d'autres biens « matériels ». Cette même année, le centre a reçu plus de 1?200 visites, dont 314 nouvelles clientes, sans compter les centaines d'appels de courriels et de textos de clientes. (Voir le document d'information ci-joint pour plus de détails, en anglais seulement.) Retirer le statut d'organisme de charité au Crisis Pregnancy Centre de Winnipeg priverait des milliers de femmes et de familles de services d'une source d'appui matériel et émotionnel.

Je reconnais le droit et la liberté de chaque personne d'avoir ses croyances relatives à l'interruption volontaire de la grossesse. Toutefois, les décisions gouvernementales devraient favoriser et renforcer cette liberté, non la brimer en retirant des aides et un soutien qui peuvent aider des femmes à prendre une libre décision et la mettre en œuvre.

We held Parenting classes, budgeting classes, cooking classes, sewing classes, fashion shows and so much more. We provided material supports such as diapers, eggs, bread, baby food, blankets children's clothing up to size 3, toys, car seats, highchairs, and so much more. The government "Child and Family Services" would often send us their clients, because we were a support to families.

Every individual has the right to make an informed decision. Women who came to the centre for advice were always made aware of ALL their options. Some chose to

1. Give the baby up for adoption
2. Keep the baby
3. Abort

RE: CHARITABLE STATUS

Thank you for serving our communities and country in your capacity as a Cabinet Minister.

I am writing this letter not just as an employee of a registered charity, but also as a concerned citizen.

I understand that the Prime Minister's mandate letter instructs the Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Finance to change the *Income Tax Act* so that "anti-abortion organizations that provide dishonest counselling to pregnant women about their rights and options" are ineligible for charitable status. I'm very concerned about this proposal for a number of reasons.

If an organization's charitable status can be put at risk simply because its views are different than those of the government, all charities are at risk. It means that every time the government adopts a new view or political priority, or any time a new government is elected, charitable status for specific groups will be in jeopardy.

No category of charity should be targeted for de-registration, singled out for more audits, or subject to additional monitoring based on whether or not its views align with those of the government. To be clear, I agree that charities shouldn't be involved in dishonest practices. But dishonest conduct by charities is already addressed by the law in other ways.

I'm also very concerned that this approach risks silencing any charity that objects to or supports changes in the law, and dictates positions they are allowed to take. Canadians hold a wide variety of views on all sorts of issues. That diversity is rightly reflected in the charitable sector. Expressing diverse views, especially on social and political issues, is fundamental to a democratic society. Charities are no exception.

Please do not implement the proposed changes. They would set a dangerous precedent and put all charities at risk. But above all of this, the value of human life, pre-born or at any time, should be given ultimate respect; we've been made even more aware over the past couple of years that, "every child matters" and "all lives matter."

Hi Marty,

My husband I both voted for you. We were impressed that you walked up our super long driveway to say, “Hi, vote for me!”

We have a concern that the current government has promised to ‘revoke the charity status’ of our Winnipeg Crisis Pregnancy Centre and of all the CPCs across Canada. It hasn’t happened yet, but the Prime Minister has, in mid-December, directed the Minister of Finance to start the process.

First off pregnancies are not all happy affairs. Some truly are a crisis (!) ... and this is the experience I want to share: About 6 years ago I mentored a young woman in her 20’s. She was single and pregnant. Not only that, but the possible father was abusive towards her. Who could she talk to?? What were her options?? Her life was totally upside-down and she had no money for counseling. I had heard of the good work of Crisis Pregnancy and pointed her in their direction.

After receiving counselling from Crisis Pregnancy she made her decision to put her child up for adoption. Crisis Pregnancy pointed her to the right agency. She ended up keeping her child (and getting away from the abusive man), in part, because Crisis Pregnancy

was there at the right time for her. Please know that her life today is a far cry from where it was. She is financially sound, is an amazing parent and lives at peace with her decision made 6 years ago.

I don't know about other Crisis Pregnancy Centers in Canada. We always get a picture in our minds of picketers shouting with political and religious agendas. Is that an American thing? ... because it's certain not the case that I am aware of here in Winnipeg ... Crisis Pregnancy Centre services go far beyond caring for the woman with an unplanned pregnancy (as the attachment will tell you). Anyway you size it up, it will be one major loss for women (because, of course, it's mostly women use this resource) largely in our West End and the Inner part of our city because of its location on Broadway.

I am told that revoking the charity status doesn't only mean that a charity (the CPC) will not be able to issue tax-receipts, it also means that ALL of the assets of the charity must be dispersed. This means that our building, properties, and donation monies will be lost. Years of good work, charity and connections in the community will be lost. Women will suffer the loss.

Above is a summary attachment of the history of/work of Crisis Pregnancy Centre (your time is precious) but if you want more information, we can forward you a longer attachment.

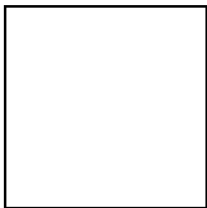

I understand that the Prime Minister's mandate letter instructs the Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Finance to change the *Income Tax Act* so that "anti-abortion organizations that provide dishonest counseling to pregnant women about their rights and options" are ineligible for charitable status.

In our opinion, the proposal will create a potentially vague and arbitrary standard. The phrase "dishonest counselling" is not currently used in any Act or regulation in Canada. Based on a legal opinion [REDACTED] has received, the phrase has no legally certain meaning and could be open to abuse and a legal challenge. Finally, if the proposal were to proceed, then it should be aimed at all organizations that provide abortion counselling. We hope that all organizations dealing with this sensitive issue will act appropriately. But it is also possible for an organization that promotes abortions to provide "dishonest counsel." To have a provision aimed at only one side of the issue could leave the provision open to a legal challenge and possible violation of the *Charter*. Some thought must also be given respecting who is to make the decision whether counsel has been dishonest and how evidence for the decision is to be gathered. It would be better to have the courts involved in making this decision as it does not seem that the Department of Finance has expertise in this area.

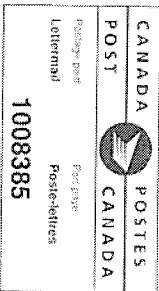

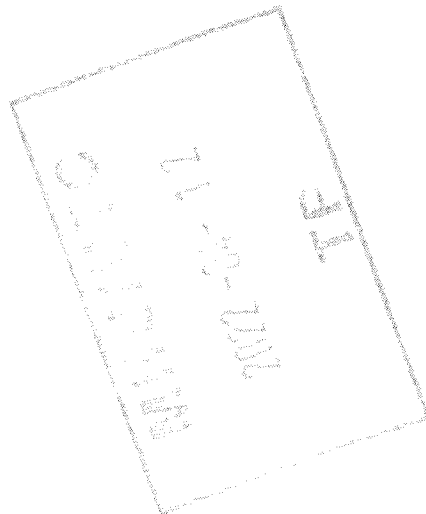

Re: Proposed Changes regarding Dishonest Behavior of Registered Charities

I am writing further to the Mandate Letter instructions to you dated December 16, 2021 which included the following ask:

Introduce amendments to the *Income Tax Act* to make anti-abortion organizations that provide dishonest counselling to pregnant women about their rights and options ineligible for charitable status, and to expand the Medical Expense Tax Credit to include costs reimbursed to surrogate mothers for IVF expenses. You will be supported in this work by the Minister for Women and Gender Equality and Youth.

I also note recent comments made in the House about the first part of these instructions:

Registered charities are provided important supports under the tax system, including an exemption from income tax and the ability to issue official donation receipts for any gifts that they receive. All Canadians should have the information they need to freely make decisions over their own bodies and have access to the medical care and services that are their legal right. Registered charities that provide reproductive health services are required to provide ACCURATE, JUDGEMENT FREE and EVIDENCE-BASED information to women with respect to their rights and options at all stages of their pregnancy. In this regard, the Government has committed to introducing amendments to the Income Tax Act to ensure that organizations that provide dishonest counseling to pregnant women are ineligible for charitable registration.”

Notwithstanding that belief, I am writing to you today because I am very concerned about the direction your government is proposing to take on this issue. There is no need for a change to the *Income Tax Act*. The common law of charity and the regulations under the *Income Tax Act* currently require a registered charity to be honest in how it provides its services to the public. CRA Guidance affirm that fact when they state that in providing its services or information to the public, a charity must be reasonably unbiased and factual¹. And behavior which is objectively harmful to charitable beneficiaries would clearly be offside the public benefit requirement that all charities must meet. To quote the CRA Policy Statement CPS-024 "Guidelines for registering a charity: Meeting the Public Benefit Test":

"The "benefit" aspect of the test concerns whether the charitable purpose under consideration is directed towards achieving a universal good that is not harmful to the public—a socially useful endeavor"

Your Government introduced changes to the political activity provisions in the *Income Tax Act* after a perceived attack on environmental charities using those provisions by the previous government. Any government targeting any type of charity for their beliefs is something we should want to avoid in Canada. Introducing an amendment such as the one proposed could result in your government being subject to the same accusation about using the regulatory system of charities to advance their political platform and satisfy their party base. And while I abhor any type of charity that is dishonest or that furthers its charitable purpose in a dishonest or misleading fashion, I am firmly of the view that the appropriate mechanism to stop that behavior currently exists and is available to the CRA.

The fight we have today in the world is to preserve a society that is willing to accept different beliefs provided all participants respect and can co-exist together. I believe that making any legislative change that targets a particular class or type of charity will weaken our regulatory system and is a mistake. It reaffirms the precedent of behavior that arose at the time of the political activity audits. Do we really want a tax system that is used by parties of different political beliefs to advance their views? The system should be agnostic and those operating within it should be held to the requirement of honest furtherance of the charitable purposes pursued without harm to their charitable beneficiaries and the general public. That is the law today and it can be and has been applied to ensure that is the case.

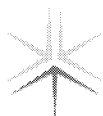
